Training in Practice-Based Research Program (TIPR) enrolls its third cohort

SFBayCRN is proud to welcome a new cohort of 39 residency trainees enrolling in the TIPR program, a practice-based research curriculum for community-based residency programs. TIPR is an online curriculum, supported by our Clinical and Translational Science Institute and mentored by local residency faculty. Many thanks to current residency program participants, including those located in the central valley (**UCSF Fresno and Valley Health**), safety net settings in the greater bay area (**Lifelong Medical Care, Contra Costa Health Services, Natividad Medical Center**), as well as additional UCSF-affiliated residency programs at **Kaiser Permanente, John Muir Health, and Sutter Santa Rosa**, for their help developing the course and enrolling and mentoring their trainees. Participants in the program complete a series of online training modules and complete a mentored scholarly project prior to graduation from residency. Dr. April Bell will lead a study entitled: “Us by Us: Black girls defining sexual and reproductive well-being”. Dr. Nicholas Rubashkin will lead a study entitled: “The UCSF Better Birth Options Study: Developing and anti-racism intervention for use along the post-cesarean care continuum”. All three studies embrace principles of community engagement and practice-based research.
