SFBayCRN Launches the "Training in Practice Based Research" for UCSF-Affiliated Community-Based Residency Programs

With support from UCSF's Clinical and Translational Science Institute, the UCSF Family Medicine Alliance, and the UCSF Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics, we have developed an online longitudinal practice-based research training program that is set to launch in September. Affectionately known as TIPR, our program will welcome its first cohort of 44 resident learners from 10 UCSF-affiliated residency programs across the bay area, central coast, and central valley. **The program provides a self-paced and structured introduction to research that includes the completion of a locally mentored research project that meets ACGME requirements and builds capacity for practice-based research collaboration across our UCSF-affiliated residency programs that are centered off campus.** We anticipate making TIPR available to additional residency programs over time.
